Summary of current play from information provided by Burwell Parish Council

This Summary of Play report has been produced by East Cambridgeshire District Council following the 2012-13 Play Audit on behalf of parish councils to help guide their planning and funding for new or upgrading play facilities.

The report includes details of current provision and any issues highlighted by Burwell Parish Council when completing the consultation. The findings are based on information provided by the parish council during 2012-13 and have been compared to the local planning standards which provide a benchmark on provision that should be available according to population size.

The findings indicate where there may be deficits and will be useful for parishes that are considering any improvements or enhancing play provision to address deficits or growth.

Play Provision and Informal Open Space

The table below identifies all play areas and areas of informal open space in Burwell, using information provided by Burwell Parish Council in September 2012.



Local provision standards set by the East Cambs Sports Facilities & Play Areas Assessment 2005 and the East Cambridgeshire Informal Open Space Study 2005 were used to measure against existing provision in order to determine whether or not there is a surplus or deficit of provision.



Analysis of existing provision in Burwell

There are currently four play areas and fifteen areas of informal open space in Burwell. All play areas cater for toddlers, juniors and youths.

Deficits and surpluses of provision

Although Burwell's play areas cater for all age groups, the audit identifies shortfalls in provision for juniors and youths. This is also backed up by Burwell Parish Council who have identified that there are insufficient play areas to meet existing community needs. There is a surplus of toddler play provision in Burwell.

Burwell Parish Council advises that there is adequate provision of informal open space, however the audit identifies that this is in fact a deficit based on the planning standard per head of population.

The map identifies that the majority of houses in Burwell fall within the radial travel distance of toddler, junior and youth play provision.

The areas that fall outside of the radial travel zone for toddler and junior play include:

- North end of North Street towards Baulk Farm
- South east of the village, including part of Newmarket Road, part of Isaacson Road, Barkways, Cornfields, the farms along Weir's Drove and parts of Kentwell Place.

The areas that fall outside of the radial travel zone for youth play include:

- Lower Portland Farm
- Slade Farm

The Parish Council state that "There are several small sites suitable for younger children but we would welcome larger areas to accommodate teenagers and extra sports facilities."

Play experiences

Burwell Parish Council scored the existing play areas using a modified version of Play England's Play Space Quality Assessment Tool Kit which considered the following criteria:

- Level of usage
- Maintenance
- Health & Safety
- Location
- Range of play experiences

The parish council identified three of the four play areas as needing some improvements to the range of play experiences provided. The parish council stated that the areas identified had either weak or average usage levels. This is a particular concern of the play area at Westhorpe as it was also identified as being in an 'good' location, therefore it may be worth considering this aspect if the play areas were to be improved.

Consultation

At the time of the audit, consultation was being carried out as part of the Burwell Masterplan.

Accessibility

Burwell Parish Council has advised that there are no specific disabled facilities but this is dependent on level of disability
