





East Cambridgeshire Community Safety Partnership (CSP) Current Action Plan



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Statutory duties

Strategic Assessment

Commission annual strategic assessment to be undertaken and agreed at Spring 2024 CSP Board.

Domestic Homicide Reviews (DHR)

CSP to support and facilitate the completion of any DHRs that are required.

CSP to work with county Domestic Abuse and Sexual Violence (DASV)/ Violence Against Women and Girls (VAWG) teams to commission further reviews as required.

When a domestic homicide happens, the police or ECDC should inform the relevant Community Safety Partnership in writing of the incident. The CSP then has overall responsibility for setting up a review.

CSP to initiate a DHR panel.

Prevent duty

Lead

Local authorities to establish or make use of an existing local multi-agency group to agree risk and co-ordinate the Prevent programme activity. Many local authorities use Community Safety Partnerships but other multi-agency forums may be appropriate.

Effectively monitor the impact of the Prevent programme work via local multiagency arrangements.

Local authorities to use the existing counter-terrorism local profiles (CTLPs), produced for every region by the police, to assess the risk of individuals being drawn into terrorism. This includes not just violent extremism but also non-violent extremism, which can create an atmosphere conducive to terrorism and can popularise views which terrorists exploit.

Local authorities to incorporate the duty into existing policies and procedures, so it becomes part of the day-to-day work of the authority. The duty is likely to be relevant to fulfilling safeguarding responsibilities in that local authorities should ensure that there are clear and robust safeguarding policies to identify children at risk.

All staff inductions cover our safeguarding policy. Corporate staff and Member inductions for introduction to safeguarding. Annual training for all staff provided by external trainers. All free training sent out to all staff, provided by Peterborough and Cambridge Safeguarding Board.

Local authorities to ensure appropriate frontline staff, including those of its contractors, have a good understanding of Prevent are trained to recognise vulnerability to being drawn into terrorism and are aware of available programmes to deal with this issue.

Local authority staff to make appropriate referrals to Channel (a programme which provides support to individuals who are at risk of being drawn into terrorism which is put on a statutory footing by Chapter 2 of Part 5 of the Counter-Terrorism and Security Act 2015) and ensure that Channel is supported by the appropriate organisation and expertise.

Local authorities to ensure that organisations who work with the local authority on Prevent are not engaged in any extremist activity or espouse extremist views.

Local authorities to take the opportunity when new contracts for the delivery of their services are being made to ensure that the principles of the duty are written in to those contracts in a suitable form.

ECDC to attend County Prevent Board and the Prevent task and finish group.

Raise the profile of Prevent in the community however you see fit, social media, posters, events.
