Your nationality

If you have more than one nationality, please include them all. You can only register to vote in the UK if you are a British, Irish or European Union citizen, or a Commonwealth citizen who has leave to enter or remain in the UK or does not require such leave. We may need additional evidence about your nationality or we may check your nationality or immigration status against government records.

Your date of birth

If you don't know your date of birth please give the date you put on official documents (for example, your passport or driving licence). Your date of birth identifies you, confirms your eligibility to vote and can be used to call people for jury service.

Changed your name?

For example, you may have got married and changed your name. You do not have to give us details of your name change but it will help us identify you. If this information is not given then you may need to provide additional documentary evidence.

The open register

There are two registers. Why?

Using information received from the public, registration officers keep two registers - the electoral register and the open register (also known as the edited register).

The electoral register

The electoral register lists the names and addresses of everyone who is registered to vote in public elections. The register is used for electoral purposes, such as making sure only eligible people can vote. It is also used for other limited purposes specified in law, such as:

- detecting crime (e.g. fraud)
- calling people for jury service
- checking credit applications.

The open register

The open register is an extract of the electoral register, but is not used for elections. It can be bought by any person, company or organisation. For example, it is used by businesses and charities to confirm name and address details. Your name and address will be included in the open register unless you ask for them to be removed. Removing your details from the open register does not affect your right to vote.

If you are concerned that having your name or address on the register may affect your safety, there could be other options available to you. In certain circumstances, you can register without your name and address showing on the register. To find out more, please contact your electoral registration office. You can find their address on P1 of this form. You can find out more information about both registers and how they may be used at gov.uk/register-to-vote

Privacy statement

We will only use the information you give us for electoral purposes. We will look after personal information securely and we will follow data protection legislation. We will not give personal information about you or any personal information you may provide on other people to anyone else or another organisation unless we have to by law.

The lawful basis to collect the information in this form is that it is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest and exercise of official authority as vested in the Electoral Registration Officer as set out in Representation of the People Act 1983 and associated regulations.

Some of the information that is collected in this form is classified as special category personal data. This is processed for reason of substantial public interest as set out in Representation of the People Act 1983 and associated regulations. To process this type of information the Data Controller must have a relevant policy document that sets out how this information will be handled.

You can register as a Crown servant or British Council employee using this form if:

- you are working outside the UK as a Crown servant (e.g. in the diplomatic service or overseas civil service) or as an employee of the British Council
- you are the spouse or registered civil partner of a Crown servant or British Council employee and you accompany them during their employment abroad

You need to be registered at the address where you would be living if you were in the UK, or at your last registered UK address.

Can I vote at all elections in the UK?

 British citizens, Irish citizens and qualifying citizens of Commonwealth countries (including Cyprus) and Malta) can vote at all elections. Qualifying citizens are Commonwealth citizens who have leave to enter or remain in the UK or do not require such leave.

Citizens of other EU countries can vote in local government elections, but cannot vote in UK parliamentary elections. Those resident in Wales may also vote in National Assembly for Wales elections. If you are an EU citizen and want to vote in European parliamentary elections you must fill in a separate form. Contact us using the details above to ask for one.
