



Decides the area to be covered (typically 20 – 50 houses) and contacts neighbours and agrees that a Scheme should be established.

Registers his/her Scheme (the registration system requires the coordinator to have an e-mail address).

Advises neighbours that the Scheme is established and provides window stickers.

Obtains signs to fix in prominent locations (not compulsory).

Identifies vulnerable people within the Scheme.



NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH WHAT DOES A COORDINATOR DO?

Receives information from the local police (this usually comes by e-mail) and passes relevant information to the neighbours.

Keeps in touch with the neighbours and welcomes new residents into the neighbourhood.

Report suspicious incidents to the police or other officials.

Generally fosters a community spirit within the Scheme and encourages the neighbours to look out for each other.
