1.0 <u>ISSUE</u>

- 1.1 To consider applications to the Section 106 Community Facilities and Small Villages Fund grant schemes.
- 1.2 The maximum grant from the Small Villages Fund is £10,000 but there is no maximum amount for applications for Allocated S106 funding provided that sufficient funds are available.

2.1.3 To provide a 'Zip wire' at the St Johns Road play area.

- 2.1.4 Installation of 70 solar light studs along Ely Riverside to link the Ely Country Park scheme and the riverside area together, providing an attractive route for walkers and cyclists.
- 2.2. Members are reminded that Section 106 contributions can be sought from developers towards the costs of providing community and social infrastructure, the need for which has arisen as a result of a new development taking place. The application form reminds applicants that S106 monies may only be spent on facilities where the new development has, at least in part, contributed to the need for the facilities.
- 2.3 The scoring system for Section 106 applications is such that those applications scoring between 0 39 are recommended for refusal.

3.0 OFFICER DELEGATED APPROVAL

3.1 Members will note that under officer delegated powers the following grants have been offered from the East Cambridgeshire Section 106 Grant Scheme:
