#### Draft East Cambridgeshire Local Plan

Consultation on a Draft East Cambridgeshire Local Plan is scheduled to take place for a 6 week period in late September/October 2012. The Draft Local Plan will provide a blueprint for the growth of the district up the year 2031. It will include Visions for every village and town, which have been drawn up in partnership with the District Council and Parish Councils. It will identify new sites for development, and set out policies to guide planning applications. The consultation will provide an opportunity for feedback on the suggested visions, sites and policies, prior to submission of the Local Plan to an independent Inspector later this year.
