An improved Station Gateway in Ely will reduce waiting times for visitors and commuters, increase employment opportunities, provide economic growth, improve customer satisfaction levels and encourage more people to visit the district. The development in North Ely will ease housing shortages, increase economic growth and employment opportunities. 	8 new apprentices will have improved routes to employment by March 2016. Outcomes	The Council has frozen the East Cambs element of Council Tax for the third year in a row. By valuing feedback and implementing new processes to meet your needs, we can truly say we are customer driven. Recent projects include: a new self-service section on the Councils' website and providing a more accessible Planning Service. The Council continues to present a balanced budget. The Council has replaced automatic pay rises with performance related pay. The Council has established the East Cambs Trading Company Limited to support the financial sustainability of the Authority. The Council has reviewed its policies and will continue to ensure that they meet the needs of our customers, whilst being efficient and streamlined.	 The Stretham and Wilburton Community Land Trust (CLT) has built 15 affordable homes and residents are currently in the process of moving in to their new homes. The Swaffham Prior CLT has built 8 affordable homes and they are now all occupied. The Council is proud to say that there are now a total of 7 CLT's within East Cambridgeshire: Kennett, Haddenham, Witchford, Soham, Stretham and Wilburton, Swaffham Prior and Fordham. The East Cambs Trading Company Limited has set up "Palace Green Homes" which will continue to offer support, advice and guidance to any local communities looking to develop CLT's. 	 The Council is currently achieving a 57% recycle rate through the "It Pays to recycle in East Cambridgeshire" campaign and continues to ensure that bins are put back tidily. Building works have started on the new Multiplex cinema in Ely. The Council continues to work closely with the developers by offering support such as planning advice and we are looking forward to the site being opened in 2017. The Council has committed £13 million to the new District leisure centre. Planning permission has been agreed, a contractor and operator have been appointed and we are on track to open the site in 2018. The Council has been continuing to support Community Leisure Trusts in Soham, Burwell, Stetchworth and The Paradise Centre, Ely, to help develop improvement plans and long term sustainability. 	 The Council has been the driving force in progressing the Southern Bypass in Ely. The tender has been awarded, the grant from Central Government has been approved and works will begin on the bypass in 2017. The Council has enshrined its commitment for free car parking in the city in the constitution. The Council has acquired land at Angel Drove in Ely to increase the number of parking spaces near the railway station and we have secured a site to increase parking spaces in Littleport. The Council continues to work with Cambridgeshire County Council to increase the flow of traffic around the District's key roundabouts. 	 The Council will be consulting with the public on the draft Local Plan. The development of the Local Plan will be a priority for the Authority moving forward, with the final document set for adoption by the autumn of 2018. The Council has been continuing to work closely with Network Rail and Cambridgeshire County Council to help progress the Soham Railway Station development. A GRIP 3 Study has now commenced. The Council continues to work with key stakeholders to bring about the ambition of developing the Station Gateway site. The development in North Ely has been granted outline planning permission and the Council has completed a Section 106 agreement to help provide new public open spaces. 	 The Council has been proud to have supported 8 new apprentices with routes to employment. The scheme will help them to develop key skills in order to secure employment in the future. The Investment Programme has now successfully completed. The Council has delivered: Securing Enterprise Zone status for Lancaster Way business park in partnership with Grovemere Property A new economic development website for the District, Enterprise East Cambridgeshire Skills development in partnership with the Greater Cambridgeshire, Greater Peterborough LEP and Ely Chamber.
