Investigation	Inspection of fly tip for evidence that could lead to enforcement action being taken, together with related enquiries.
Warning letter	Used where formal enforcement action is not considered appropriate as a warning of the potential consequences of further infringements.
Statutory Notice	A legal requirement to provide information that will assist with investigation of an offence.
Fixed Penalty Notice	Agreement to accept a standard penalty fee as an alternative to formal legal action.
Duty of Care Inspection	Check that a business has correct arrangements in place for the storage, transport and disposal of its waste.
Stop & Search	Check on vehicle carrying waste for waste carriers licence and waste disposal documentation.

An offender having admitted an offence is formerly cautioned by the Head of Service. A record is kept of the Caution for 5 years.

Priority - Clarification on Quy traffic scheme, timescale for review and outcome	
Objective	To provide information on the outcome of the County Council's review of this traffic calming scheme.
Action Taken	The report on the review of the traffic calming scheme was completed on 17 June 2013 and a copy was sent to the Parish Council on 2 July 2013.
Current Situation	The review included an assessment of speed monitoring data, consultation with residents an examination of accident statistics.  Although the scheme seems to be unpopular with residents, there is no justification for the County Council to spend its limited financial resources for road safety activities on removal of this scheme. There would, however, be no significant problems if the Parish Council wished to consider providing funding for the removal of this scheme.
Continue or Discharge?	Discharge. The question asked of the County Council has been answered. Any wish to pursue this further would be a matter for the Parish Council.

1	When is Quy review being carried out and reported back. This could influence Bottisham and their plans so can it be fed back ASAP? Could other forms of traffic calming be explored for the area rather than just get rid of traffic calming altogether?	The report on the review of the traffic calming scheme was completed on 17 June 2013 and a copy was sent to the Parish Council on 2 July 2013.  The review included an assessment of speed monitoring data, consultation with residents and an examination of accident statistics.  Although the scheme seems to be unpopular with residents, there is no justification for the County Council to spend its limited financial resources for road safety activities on removal of this scheme. There would, however, be no significant problems if the Parish Council wished to consider providing funding for the removal of this scheme. There was strong public support for a reduction in the speed limit; this is something else that the Parish Council may wish to consider pursuing (and funding).

<b>Objective</b>	To reduce ASB in Burwell																
<b>Action Taken</b>	Regular patrols have taken place in Burwell during this period, specifically to combat any ASB issues																
<b>Current Situation</b>	<p>During this period ASB has reduced by 3 incidents (8.3%). <b>Objective</b>	To reduce shed/garage burglary
<b>Action Taken</b>	Regular patrols have been conducted overnight in the area – concentrating on major routes that would appear to be being used by offenders.
<b>Current Situation</b>	<p>During this period offences of non dwelling burglary have continued, though the neighbourhood has since the number of burglaries fall from 19 to 17 offences (-11.5%).                      Offenders believed to have been active in this area have been arrested and are currently on bail in relation to East Cambs and Suffolk offences.                      Proactive night-time patrols in the area remain an ongoing priority, and regular meeting are taking place with police</p>

colleagues in Suffolk and Norfolk to share intelligence in relation to cross-border criminality.

Of late shed/garage burglaries have been occurring less frequently, and vehicle crime appears to be more of an issue – with a particular focus around the Burwell area.

Insp Ormerod was not invited to attend the Bottisham PC AGM, which is why he did not attend their AGM.
<b>3</b>	Issue of response from Police Force Control Room. Control room not recognising that the issue was in Cambridgeshire (A11 cycling	This issue has been addressed with the FCR. The incident was recognised as being in Cambridgeshire, and the query was over the informant’s home address. It has now been clarified that the informant’s home address does show as Cambridgeshire on our systems, and feedback has been given to the informant.

4	Details of ASB incidents to Burwell Parish Council.	PCSO Hawkins has been in regular contact with Burwell PC in relation to specific ASB issues and incidents.
5	Details of Litter Bin fires on Burwell Parish Council properties.	Only one report of arson has been made to Police in 2013. This relates to a bin fire at Mendeville Hall on 03/03/13.
6	Speeding on North Street and Newmarket Road, Burwell.	Numerous speed checks carried out at these locations. Drivers reported for speeding – 2 Drivers given words of advice – 18
7	Would like information the effectiveness of Speed checks being carried out in Kirtling (i.e. success rates, figures).	Speed checks have been carried out and the results fed back to Kirtling PC. No vehicles have been observed speeding at this location.
8	Would like to know what the rules are around selling gold effectively for scrap but not coming under the same rules as scrap metal dealers. Is there anything that can be done?	Jewellers dealing in scrap gold are not covered by the same legislation as scrap metal dealers owning scrapyards. It would require a change in legislation to amend this, and this is best achieved by lobbying your local M.P.
