and recover from such events, such as severe weather and extreme rainfall.

We attend the 13 Local Resilience Forums across our area. including Cambridgeshire and Peterborough LRF. This gives us an opportunity to work with our partners such as the police, fire service and local authorities to ensure a coherent multi-agency response to emergencies. We work very closely within these forums and actively contribute to multi-agency plans and exercises for the different threats and hazards we face. The different threats and hazards are identified in the National Risk Register, which is a Government assessment of the threats and hazards facing the UK. We use this assessment to identify the threats and hazards facing our business. severe weather is one of those identified and we have robust business continuity plans in place. An independent assessment is carried out to certify our systems and processes meet the requirements within the international standard ISO22301, this is the international standard for business continuity which we have held since 2010.

We also work with our Lead Local Flood Authorities, including Cambridgeshire County Council developing local flood risk management plans. We were part of the group which produced the local flood risk management plan for Cambridgeshire and several surface water management plans.

Anglian Water are an advocate of sustainable drainage and we are the only water company to offer adoption of these assets to facilitate their use. Sustainable drainage systems are a more effective way of dealing with extreme rainfall events by managing the water on the surface, rather than channelling it into underground sewers. What are your plans to cope with growth and population increase?

Anglian Water are a statutory consultee to the Local Plan process, which enables us to plan for the amount of growth set out within local plans. One of the ways that we do this is by supporting the preparation of water cycle strategies, which are a snapshot in time. We also use other sources of data to plan, including Local Planning Authority Annual Monitoring Reports.

We have been involved in providing comments and information to formulate the East Cambridgeshire District Council Water Cycle Study completed in 2011 and East Cambridgeshire District Council's Local Plan.

Anglian Water have a legal obligation to accommodate the additional flow from sites with planning permission at the receiving Water Recycling Centres or WRC (formally known as Sewage Treatment Works). Each WRC will be monitored and any work or consent changes required will be managed by Anglian Water when deemed appropriate in accordance with our periodic review with our regulator Ofwat.

With regards to the network capacity to cater for the additional flows, we recommend developers and consultants engage with Anglian

			Water as early as possible. We offer a pre planning service where we view each site on an individual basis and determine if there is sufficient capacity within the network to accommodate the proposed development. Where the proposed development will result in an unacceptable risk of flooding, we will identify mitigation to ensure there is no detriment caused by the additional flow. This work will be funded by the developer. Anglian Water are not a statutory consultee to planning applications. However, we do comment on major applications (over 10 dwellings) and work with East Cambridgeshire District Council to recommend the addition of foul and/or surface water conditions to protect our existing and future customers. Investigation

Warning letter Statutory Notice Fixed Penalty Notice Inspection of fly tip for evidence that could lead to enforcement action being taken, together with related enquiries.

Used where formal enforcement action is not considered appropriate as a warning of the potential consequences of further infringements.

A legal requirement to provide information that will assist with investigation of an offence. Agreement to accept a standard penalty fee as an alternative to formal legal action.

Check that a business has correct arrangements in place for the storage, transport and

disposal of its waste.

Check on vehicle carrying waste for waste carriers licence and waste disposal

documentation.

An offender having admitted an offence is formerly cautioned by the Head of Service. A

record is kept of the Caution for 5 years.

As Formal Caution, but investigation and clear up costs are charged to the offender.

Formal prosecution through the Court System.

Objective	To address the community's concerns regarding road and verge maintenance in the Little Downham area.
Action	
Taken	Specific repair Works on West Fen/Coveney Road have been undertaken and routine maintenance works are ongoing across the area. The County Council needs to prioritise the road maintenance works that it carries out, making the most effective use of the budget available. Roads should be done approx every 6-8 weeks although this can be affected by weather, vehicle breakdowns and staff sickness.
Current Situation	See Action Taken section above.
Continue or Discharge?	Discharge. The information provided above has outlined the Local Highway Authority's approach to these issues.

responsibility t	routing agreement with straw burning plant. Straw everywhere – no need to come through Haddenham. CCC has a o ensure roads are clear, however, straw is clogging up drains. ECDC have responsibility to ensure roads are litter ed cutting, as branches sweeping straw from tops of lorries. Haddenham (Station Road), Wilburton and A142.
Objective	To address, within the extent of the powers of the County Council, the difficulties caused by straw being deposited on the public highway.

Action Taken	Letters have been sent to property owners regarding the need for them to undertake pruning and cutting back of trees.
	With regard to trees sweeping straw off tops of lorries, the Local Highway Authority has no power to deal with any branches which are more than 15 feet above the ground.
	Once straw transportation processes are finished for this year, gullies and drains will be cleaned.
	East Cambridgeshire District Council is responsible for clearing any loose straw debris on the road, as part of its street cleaning regime.
	It is suggested that the Chairman of the Neighbourhood Panel may wish to send a letter to the Elean Power Station in relation to the community's concerns about the impact of straw falling from lorries.
	Signage for lorries is adequate; there is little else that the Local Highway Authority could do to prevent lorries travelling through Haddenham.
Current Situation	Detailed within the Action taken section of this document.
Continue or Discharge?	Discharge. The County Council, as Local Highway Authority, has taken all the action that it can in this matter.

7	Mepal	Road from Earith Bridge to Willingham – bad. Is anything being done?	This stretch of the B1050 lies within South Cambridgeshire. The Local highway Authority is well aware of the poor condition of this piece of public highway and is looking at long-term solutions to address the matter. None of these options, which have been shared with Willingham Parish Council, are without very significant costs. Therefore, until a longer-term solution can be agreed and funded, the Local Highway Authority will continue to undertake necessary repair works. In fact, carriageway repair works were undertaken, as a result of a recent routine safety inspection, to the B1050 on 15 September 2013.
8	Sutton	Carpond Lane, no-through road, serves village primary school. Car parking probs on peoples driveways. Dust cart couldn't get down to collect rubbish. People having to drive on footpath. Could yellow lines be considered?	Double yellow lines could be considered but would require third-party funding. This is the sort of scheme that could be the subject of a future Local Highways Improvements scheme bid by the Parish Council, if it felt this to be a priority for the local community.

Objective	To enforce speed limits and educate drivers
Action Taken	Speed checks conducted on a number of occasions. Very positive feedback from local residents but no speeding drivers observed.
	Speedwatch checks on Haddenham Road, Wilburton, resulted in 84 letters being sent to speeding motorists (at least 50% of these were from the local area). 981 vehicles were monitored during these checks.
Current Situation	Police enforcement has not resulted in any prosecutions, but may well have had a deterrent effect on speeding motorists. Speedwatch activity would suggest that motorists are still speeding on the A1123, though a lower proportion than many other locations.
Continue or Discharge?	For panel decision – though other locations should also be considered for speed enforcement.
